

After explaining a critical event, ask the preceptee these questions to facilitate discussion and reflection:

- What was happening with the patient?
- How did we know what was happening with the patient?
- What interventions might have been appropriate?
- How could we tell if those interventions were working?
- What else might have been done?
- What went well?
- What were the greatest challenges or complications within this situation?
- How might they have been handled differently?
